Veneer matching is an arrangement of different veneer leaves to create diverse patterns.


This process creates unique looks for each project, different veneer layups result in different grain appearances.



Veneer Matching


Book Matching

One piece of veneer is turned over to join the adjacent piece, much like turning the pages of a book. This is the most common match resulting in a balanced grain pattern.



Slip <u>Matching</u>

A method of matching veneers for the face of plywood where consecutive sheets of veneer are slipped out, side by side and joined together with a repetition of the same grain appearance.



Random Matching

Veneers are put together at random without matching the grain.
